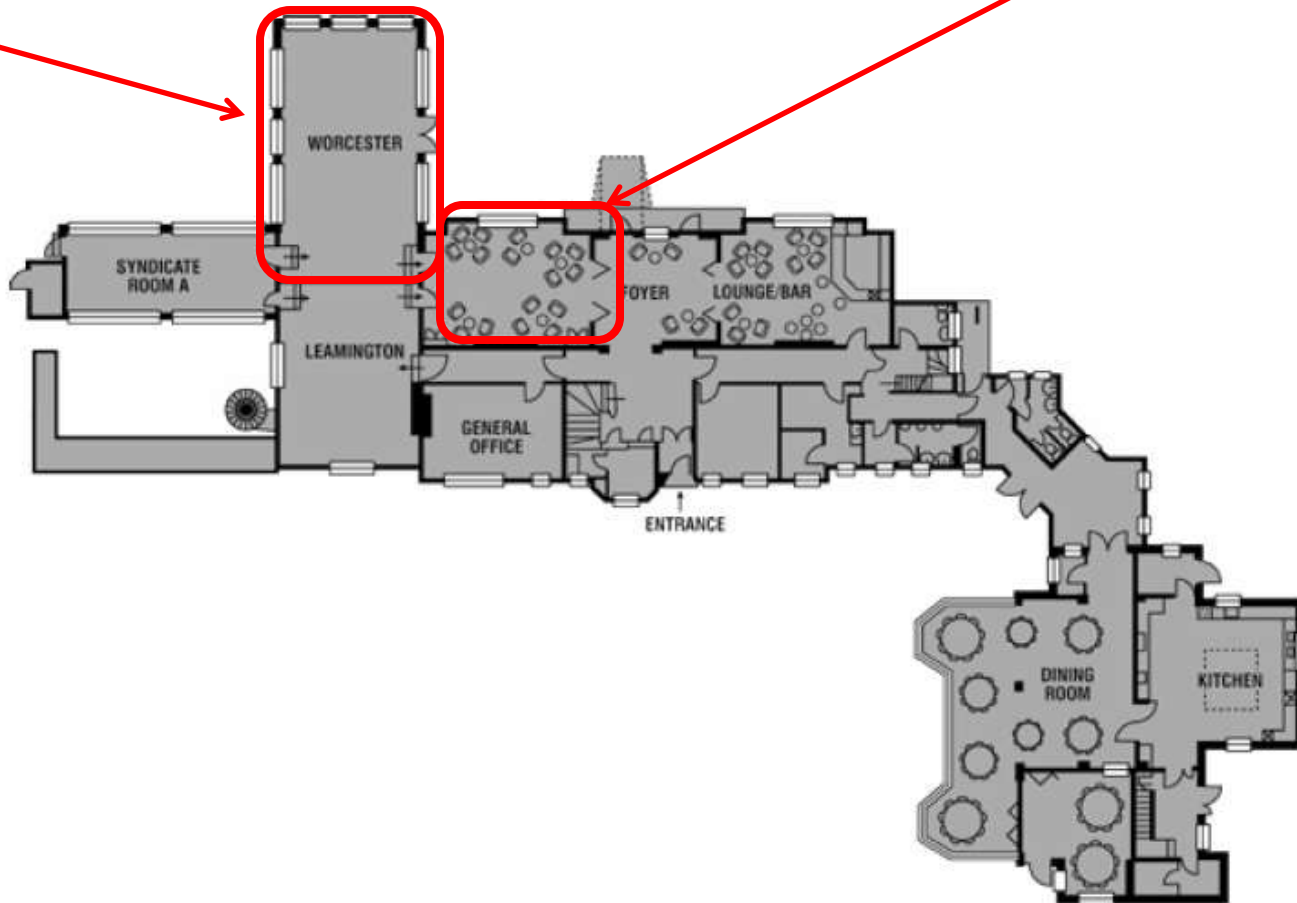

By Road:

From the M6 Motorway: Leave at junction 6, signposted Birmingham Central, and join the A38(M). At the end of the motorway keep right, go over a flyover and through three underpasses to join the A38 Bristol Road. The University is on your right, 2 miles from the City Centre. Turn right into Edgbaston Park Road by the Gun Barrels Pub and the Conference Park Reception is 228.6m further up on your right, in Lucas House.

From the M5 Motorway: Leave at junction 4, signposted Birmingham SW, and join the A38. Keep going on the A38 for around 6 miles. After passing the University gates on your left, take the first left into Edgbaston Park Road. The Conference Park reception is 228.6m further up on your right, in Lucas House.

By Rail: The nearest mainline station is Birmingham New Street, with good links to cities across the UK. From here, a taxi to the Conference park takes around 10 minutes.

University Station, on the Cross-City line, ie next to the University Campus, is 10 minute walk to the Conference Park. There is no taxi rank at this station.

By Air: Birmingham International Airport is around 10 miles from the Conference Park. The taxi journey takes about 30 minutes.
